

## Way of the turtle apple

Spruce /Kristina Vanni Turtle candy is a sweet confectionery developed in the early 1900s as a combination of whole pecans topped with caramel and dipped in chocolate. The shape was similar to a turtle, so the name stuck. Today, any dessert with this signature combination of pecan, caramel and chocolate taste is often called turtle. This cheesecake is cooked with sweet pecans and graham cracker crust, then filled with classic cream cheese filling. As soon as the cheesecake comes out of the oven, homemade caramel filling is poured on top. Finally, more chopped pecans and mini chocolate chips are sprinkled all over the caramel filling. For extra flair and a beautiful presentation, whole pecans adorn the edge of the cheesecake. For the crust: 1 cup graham cracker crumbs 1/4 cup pecans (sliced) 2 tablespoons brown sugar 1/2 cup unapproachable butter (melted) To fill: 3 (8-ounce) packets cream cheese (room temperature) 3 large eggs (lightly beaten) 1 (8-ounce) boxes of sour cream 1 cup granulated sugar 1 cup granulated sugar 2 teaspoons vanilla extract 1/4 teaspoon salt For topping: 1 cup brown sugar 1/4 cup unsalted butter 2 tablespoons heavy whipped cream 1/4 cup pecans (sliced) 1/4 cup mini chocolate chips 1 to 1 1/2 cups pecans (half) ingredients. Spruce / Christina Vanney For the crust, mix the graham cracker crumbs, chopped pecans, brown sugar, and melted butter in a bowl until the crumbs are moistened. Spruce/Christina Vanney Press the mixture over the bottom lightly oiled 9-inch springform pan. Cool until cool. Heat the oven to 375 F. Wrap the springform pan in heavy duty in foil to prevent any spilling on the floor of the oven. A rim baking sheet can also be placed under the cheesecake as it bakes to catch any drips. Spruce / Christina Vanney For the toppings, put the cream cheese, eggs, sour cream, granulated sugar, vanilla and salt in a large mixer bowl. Beat until well blended. Spruce / Christina Vanney Pour the filling over the chilled crust. Bake until the edges are set and the center is still a little loose, about 60 minutes or until the cake puffs and trembles slightly when shaken. Don't overbake. The cheesecake will settle down and firm as it cools down. Spruce / Christina Vanney Remove the cheesecake from the oven. Cool on a wire rack until completely cooled. Cover lightly with plastic wrap. Cool to cool, a few hours overnight. Spruce / Christina Vanney Topping, put 1 cup brown sugar, 1/4 cup butter, and cream in a medium saucepan. Heat to a boil at a high temperature, stirring occasionally, until the sugar has dissolved. Remove from heat. Cool a bit, but not completely. Spruce / Christina Vanney Pour topping on top of the chilled cake at the same time warm enough to pour. Spruce / Christina Vanney Sprinkle Sliced Nuts and Mini Chocolate Chips Topping. Box turtles are wonderful creatures and they can be good pets, but you have to think long and hard before you bring one home. While juvenile turtle boxes usually adapt to indoor terrarium, most experts agree that the best adult accommodation is outdoors. If you have the means to build a good sized outdoor handle for your turtle box, you should think twice before getting a turtle box. If the turtle will be kept indoors, you will have to consider creating a custom enclosure or invest in a very large terrarium. It will also need a giant source of heat and ultraviolet light. Box turtles are not easy to care for or low maintenance pets. If you can keep them healthy, they can be with you a long time and you may have to make provisions for someone to take care of them if something happens to you. They are known to live for more than 50 years as pets. Unfortunately, many turtle boxes that find their way into the pet trade end up dying earlier, due to a misunderstanding of the care they require. It is also important to understand that in most states, it is illegal to take a box of turtles from the wild and keep it in captivity. Wild populations are declining, so they are protected in most states. In addition, wild box turtles are likely to become seriously stressed in captive conditions and do not make large pets. If you decide the turtle box is right for you, make an effort to find a captive-bred turtle box. There are several different species and subspecies of turtle boxes you can find in pet trading. Most are quite similar to care, but there are some important differences. Before you take home a turtle box, make sure you know what your particular species will need. North American turtle boxes most commonly stored as pets include the following: The following North American box turtles are less often kept as pets. They tend to be in limited geographic ranges and have more specialized needs: Florida Box Turtle (Terrapene Carolina Bowri)Mexican Turtle Box (Terrapene Carolina mexicana)Yucatan Box Turtle (Terrapene Carolina yucatana)Desert Box Turtle (Terrapene ornata luteola)Coahuila Box Turtle (Terrapene coahuila)Nayarit (Spotted) Box Turtle (Terrapene nelsoni nelsoni) Asian turtles need higher temperatures and humidity, than their North American counterparts. Some of them require enough water for bathing as well. The species you've seen Found in the pet trade include: Indochinese (Flower) Box Turtle (Cuora galbinifrons)Chinese (yellow-marginated) Box Turtle (Cuora flavomarginata) Chinese three-lane Box Turtle (Cuora trifasciata) Malayan Box Turtle (Cuora amboinensis) Injury, to appropriate care sheets for your particular tortoise. If stored outdoors, they can graze on natural plants and insects that are found in their pen, in addition to the food you give them. Provide a lair or burrow they can go to get out of the rain and protect them at night. In winter, they burrow underground and hibernate until spring temperatures warm the ground. The temperature in their indoor habitat should range from 70-90 degrees Fahrenheit (21-32 degrees Celsius) to allow the turtle to adjust its temperature by moving between warmer and cooler areas. A 75-100 watt heat bulb or ceramic heat emitter is needed to provide a warmer area than the rest of the container. They need ultraviolet light to produce vitamin D3 so they can absorb calcium from the diet. Box turtles are omnivorous, eat both plant and animal tissue. Feed them with dark green leafy vegetables such as greens, mustard greens, parsley, endive/escarole, dandelion greens and flowers, beet tops, spinach and cabbage. They can also eat a small amount of green beans, Romain salad, and fruits such as mulberry, blackberry, raspberry, and sliced apples. For meaty meals, use crickets, mealworms, earthworms, slugs, or a small amount of low-fat canned dog food, and even better, there are ready meals available in pet stores specifically for turtle boxes. The turtle box enjoy soaking in the water, so provide a dish of water large enough for them to fit in, but with low enough sides that they can easily climb into it. Change the water often to make it clean.
